

**A RESOLUTION TO ALLOCATE FUNDS FOR THE MUSIC MATTERS 2016
SPRINGFEST**

- 2 **WHEREAS,** MUSIC Matters is a University of Michigan student organization that
hosts an annual spring charity concert and day of community engagement
[called SpringFest] on campus; **AND**
- 4 **WHEREAS,** in the four years since MUSIC Matters' founding, they have brought J.
6 Cole, Ben Folds, 2 Chainz, and Common to campus and donated \$10,000
to C.S. Mott Children's Hospital, endowed and awarded \$50,000 to
8 endow a student-funded, need-based scholarship at UM, and announced
the creation of a summer leadership camp for underserved Detroit youth
to take place at UM; **AND**
- 10 **WHEREAS,** this year's SpringFest is fundamentally focused on building and creating
12 community and will take place on April 13th, 2016 on the Michigan Diag;
AND
- 14 **WHEREAS,** SpringFest will showcase the best of the University of Michigan and will
16 allow all student organizations to engage with the entire campus
community, including student groups from the innovation, arts,
sustainability, social identity, music and community service groups on
campus; **AND**
- 18 **WHEREAS,** SpringFest 2016 will include: a “shark tank” pitch event, a collaborative
20 fashion show for the Flint community, a live philanthropy/service
section, an instrument drive, a sustainability zone, live music from major
record labels, local food trucks, and much more; **AND**
- 22 **WHEREAS,** organizations on campus are hosting large events and exhibits including
24 but not limited to: MPowered hosting MTank, Seven Mile Music hosting
an instrument drive for public schools, Greek organizations collaborating
26 to host a power hour to highlight individual philanthropies, Empty Mug
Records hosting an acoustic instrument garden, Hip-Hop Congress
28 hosting a collaborative spoken word/rap cypher, Circle K and MUSIC
Matters hosting live-service opportunities for students, Consider
30 Magazine bringing in Detroit vendors/startups for *The Detroit Section*,
optiMize and StartUM exhibiting campus entrepreneurial teams, Bronze
32 Elegance, EnspiRED Fashion, NoiR Fashion, and Shei Magazine hosting
a fashion show themed after children books doubling as a book drive for
Flint public schools and much more; **AND**

34 **WHEREAS,** the entire day of festivities [SpringFest & the concert] will touch an
36 estimated 13,000 students [~3,200 at concert and ~10,000 at SpringFest];
AND

38 **WHEREAS,** MUSIC Matters has worked to include Schools, Colleges, and Academic
40 Units including, but not limited to: College of Engineering highlighting
42 *One Cool Thing*, The Duderstadt Library showcasing technology in the
44 Technology Zone, The Center of Entrepreneurship sponsoring the Startup
Village, The School of Music Theater and Dance showcasing the school
sponsored jazz improv group, The Graham Sustainability Institute and
SSI Board partnering to make SpringFest a zero waste event, The School
of Art and Design promoting entrepreneurial students in the Startup
Village, and much more; **AND**

46 **WHEREAS,** the cost of this year's events will be higher than in the past due to the
48 additional infrastructure necessary to include more student organizations,
increased tenting and production needs for a larger event, and staging for
performances; **AND**

50 **WHEREAS,** CSG has donated \$10,000 to MUSIC Matters Winter of 2014 and 2015;
AND

52 **WHEREAS,** per University policy, MUSIC Matters must have all funds for the entire
concert in its account before it can make an offer to an artist; **AND**

54 **RESOLVED,** that the Central Student Government shall transfer \$4,387 from the
56 Legislative Discretionary Account to MUSIC Matters for the funding of
the event with the understanding that in future years, MUSIC Matters will
58 seek funding from the CSG Sponsored Activities account or SOFC
instead of Legislative Discretionary; **AND BE IT FURTHER**

60 **RESOLVED,** that it be requested the Central Student Government Executive team
transfer \$5,613 from the Executive Discretionary Account to MUSIC
Matters for the funding of the event; **AND BE IT FURTHER**

62 **RESOLVED,** At least two CSG Representative, appointed by the executive committee,
64 act as a liaison to MUSIC Matters. The liaison would attend SpringFest
Committee meetings, where CSG can provide guidance and expertise in
hosting a large event; **AND BE IT FINALLY**

66 **RESOLVED,** that CSG Commissions be invited to collaborate with MUSIC Matters to
help shape the vision for each of the themed areas at Spring Fest (i.e

Entrepreneurship Commission be invited to design the Innovation Hub at SpringFest).
