**Statement of Certification**

We hereby certify that the results conveyed in this document, as well as those contained in the accompanying spreadsheet, are true and accurate given the interpretations and enforcement decisions stated above. We affirm that only those write-in ballots that were “derogatory” were scrubbed from the results contained in the accompanying spreadsheet. We further affirm that those interpretations and enforcement decisions are based on the currently binding interpretation of the Constitution of the Student Body of the Ann Arbor Campus of the University of Michigan and Election Code by the Central Student Judiciary.

Finally, we acknowledge with grave concern and utmost disapproval the ruling of the Central Student Judiciary in W-18-001. We are *unanimous* in our condemnation of this reckless decision and naked judicial activism by a CSJ that seems not to understand the historical context and precedent upon which we still believe our opinion in *Nwansi* to have been properly based. While we are bound by it today, we find the CSJ's opinion to be internally confusing, astonishingly overreaching, and quite literally unsupported by any relevant case law, statutes, or facts. Unfortunately, we fear that the CSJ's pernicious follies in this regard will only further embolden losing candidates and parties to selfishly continue to hold up the seating of duly-elected future Assemblies with frivolous litigation and dilatory tactics, as occurred this year. This cannot be permitted.

We can but hope that the Eighth Assembly corrects these most egregious errors of the CSJ with amendments to the Election Code and in so doing relegates the CSJ's opinion in W-18-001 to its proper place: the dustbin of history. We plan to incorporate recommendations for such amendments into our statutorily-prescribed set of recommendations in the Election Director's final report to the Assembly. We implore the Eighth Assembly to so amend the Code.
